Principals Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the new school year. I take this opportunity to warmly welcome our new families into our community and look forward to seeing many of you at the Meet the Teacher Night on Monday 20th February. Staff returned to school on Friday 27th January to undertake

training around positive and preventative practices that promote a safe school environment at Jennings Street School. They generally appeared rested, revitalized and prepared for a fresh start to the school year. A year that we hope will take us back to pre-covid conditions. I'm sure that many of you were not feeling quite so refreshed after the longest holiday period and trust that you have had an opportunity to recoup and get back into your routine. With learning data already collated (excepting for new students) and overarching planning frameworks in place, teachers have been developing rapport with new student cohorts and establishing meaningful learning routines. This week teachers commenced the process of aligning individual student learning data to the Victorian Curriculum in order to draft priority learning goals in English, Maths and Persoanl and Social learning for your child. This work is at the forefront of our work as it drives planning documentation, teaching and grouping for instruction.

A small number of students have found the school start a little tricky to navigate. Interventiosn for these students are managed by the Student Wellbeng Team. This team comprises diverse expertise and is charged with supporting families experiencing significant issues associated with managing complex presentations of autism. We welcome Melissa Allport back onsite Monday's and Thursday's as part of this team. Melissa's role as Parent Liaision Officer is pivotal in promopting a positive partnership between home and school.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

The first School Council Meeting for 2023 will be conducted at **6.30 pm on Tuesday 28**th **February,** with School Council Elections set to take place in the coming weeks in Readiness for The **Annual General Meeting** conducted in March. In this newsletter I have detailed information around **the role of school council** in shaping the direction of the school and the programs and resources that it provides.

I take this opportunity to thank the 2022 school council for the ongoing support that they provided to me within my role. There will be **2 vacancies** within the "Parent Category "for 2023 and I strongly encourage interested parents to inquire further about the role. The upcoming vacancies and election process will be discussed at our next meeting.



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Healthy Lunch Boxes and Eating Policy

Victorian government schools including primary, secondary, special and language schools, should support a healthy eating culture by developing healthy—school food services and promoting healthy eating principles. Schools should ensure healthy food choices are the major option made available to the school community by their school and should never supply high sugar content drinks or confectionery.

The policy applies to:

- all foods and drinks provided in the following areas within the school environment:
- school canteens and contracted school food services
- external businesses and retail food outlets supplying schools (for example, milk bars, cafes, restaurants, and bakeries)
- school curriculum activities (e.g., meal preparation and community access)
- rewards and incentives
- school sporting days, social events, and productions
- school-based breakfast programs

This policy does not apply to:

- foods and drinks used for the management of individual student's health conditions
- student lunches and snacks brought from home.
- student birthday celebrations (cake only supplied by families)
- JSS school celebration days
- non-school-related events and activities managed by external organisations on school grounds, for example community sport school camps.

Implementation Strategies

JSS will send home a general permission form at the commencement of each year:

- requesting permission for students to consume foods offered during specific events listed under the 'does not apply' section of this policy. Students who do not have this permission form signed will be excluded from consuming food provided by the school.
- asking families to opt in/out of providing a birthday cake for their child. If they choose to provide a cake, they must detail the ingredients.

Camps, Sports, and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps, and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card, or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students and \$225 for eligible secondary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through Jennings Street School last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.



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CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 - General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one
- · on the first day of Term two
- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent. and:
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy: https://www2.education.vic.gov.au/pal/camps-sports-and-excursions-fund/policy

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/Pages/csef.aspx

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

- 1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.
 - Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.
 - If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card
 - If you are seeking special consideration, mark this in the form and provide a copy of the relevant documentation.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- 3. Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2023 closes on the 23 June 2023

- · Attend monthly meetings (8 meetings in total) and it would be an advantage if you could also participate in a sub committee meeting (this is negotiable)
- · help create and check the school's budget
- contribute to the school strategic plan
- make decisions on policies like investments, payments by parents, dress code.

Welcoming your child back to school

Dear parents and carers,

We are looking forward to welcoming our students back to school and into the classroom from the start of Term 1.

We want to support your child to have a positive start to the year. We will do this by:

- helping your child to re-establish face-to-face friendships and routines.
- talking to you about your child's wellbeing and using the school's wellbeing staff and programs to meet your child's needs.
- ensuring we understand where your child is up to with their learning and providing targeted support to help your child progress.

Schools will make sure your child is as safe as possible and will focus on:

- washing hands and hygiene,
- mask wearing,
- physical distancing and other COVID Safe practices
- rapid antigen testing.

Support for students

Our school has access to a range of specialist staff and programs that can provide additional support for your child, depending on their needs. This includes tutors who will work with small groups of students to help them catch up on their learning and staff with expertise in mental health and wellbeing who can provide direct support to students who need it.

Any school can access Student Support Services staff who respond to a range of student health and wellbeing needs. Secondary school students can access support from the Mental Health Practitioner at their school as well as dedicated access to headspace counselling.

Free rapid antigen tests *This advice has come directly from the Department

Free rapid antigen tests will be available for the first four weeks of Term 1 2022. These will be distributed next week. I appreciate that some parents will find undertaking these tests, difficult with their child. A recommendation may be to take a quick nasal swap whilst sleeping.

Testing is strongly recommended twice a week for students and staff.

Specialist school students will distribute 5 daily tests for the school week.

You do not need to buy your own RAT kits.

If your child uses a RAT and the result is positive, you will need to:

- let the school know.
- keep your child at home for 7 days. *We are currently querying the 7 days and will update you ASAP
- contact the Department of Health via the COVID-19 Positive Rapid Antigen Test Self-Reporting Form or call centre on 1800 675 398.

A video about RAT testing in many different languages, is available online.

If you have concerns about your child's progress, please contact: Rosie, Monique or Melissa at the school.

They will be happy to meet and discuss how our school can work in partnership with you to support your child to ensure they can progress to the next year level with confidence and have a positive learning experience.

PY1 have had had a great start to the year! I am so pleased with how successful the transition back to school has been for all student in PY1 and it has been very pleasing to see all of them showing success in following their schedules and participating in work throughout the day.



In our Maths unit of work, we have been looking at Time. We have been learning about day and night and sorting activities that we do as either happening in the daytime or the night-time. We have also been learning to follow visuals schedules and complete a sequence of steeps of activities.

In Shared Reading we have read My First Day at School and the Big Red Bath. Students focus for the first couple of weeks has been to sit with group, attend to text and make comments on what they see and what they like. Our Shared Reading sessions are followed by Predictable Chart Written lessons where we learn how to structure sentences, order words, trace and write.







PY1 has also participated in some very successful Relationship Based Play session with staff the past two weeks. These sessions allow students to explore new objects, games, areas and interact with different people. It is a

great way for everyone to get to know each other! It has also been a lovely way for the PY staff to get to know each individual student and create successful learning environment and relationships with the students.
